The Georgia Tech Center for Urban Research invites applications for its 2026–2027 fellowship program. The Center works across university, community, nonprofit, and municipal sectors to develop and evaluate solutions that address social, economic, and racial inequities in urban areas.

Who Should Apply

Graduate and undergraduate students interested in urban research, community engagement, and equitable neighborhood change are encouraged to apply. Graduate fellows will receive a \$6,000–\$9,000 stipend over the academic year, while undergraduate fellows will be hired as research assistants. Undergraduate fellows will be hired as research assistants.

Fellow Responsibilities

Fellows will contribute to the Center’s research and outreach agenda through collaborative research, evaluation, and partnership-building activities. They will also participate in Center events, produce public-facing writing, and deliver at least one research presentation during the academic year.
